# TREASURER'S REPORT FOR

Financial Year 2022-2023



#### This year has seen us adjusting back to a financial regime without the additional funding from the Keep Connected and Health Initiative Grants. We have managed to maintain our public profile and services to our member Sheds and achieved an approximate break even outcome.

The Surplus indicated in our Financial Statements is inflated by the amount of \$75K for the Regional Coordinator Program which was received on the 22nd June. There is also a smaller amount of \$5k being a Grant from TasCoss for their 'Smoke Free' Grant Initiative of which we have already expended \$1400. The result of these two amounts being unspent at 30th June is that \$78.6k should be deducted from the Surplus/(Loss) segment of the Receipts and Payments schedule with the resultant figure of a \$2k loss being the more realistic amount. Our financial position remains solid due to the Committees budgetary considerations and more importantly due to the continued outstanding support we receive from the State Government.

The TMSA could not exist without State Government support for our operating costs along with the generous support for our Grant rounds with benefits going directly to our members, all of which is acknowledged and greatly appreciated. We also receive funding from the Federal Government for the Regional Coordinator Program, this has enabled us to allow our Executive Officer (Wendy) to be available to our members for five days per week undertaking both roles. We are not certain that the funding for the Regional Coordinator will continue in 2024/25, note that we have already been paid the final instalment of funding for this, if it does not then we will find ourselves in a very awkward financial position and without further assistance we will not be able to have Wendy involved with us full time. Wendy continues to be of great help to all involved with TMSA and I would like to take this opportunity to offer my personal appreciation for her outstanding efforts.

Our members also benefit from the Federal Government Grants Program administered via AMSA plus the aforementioned TMSA Grants Program. Both these Grants are currently open and your participation by way of application for them is encouraged. The TMSA Program is for a total of \$175k and is well worth applying for. We continue to have much appreciated support from Aurora with funding for our Newsletter, also Carbatec by way of Newsletter Advertising and their generous discount program for Mens Sheds, plus Sharp Airlines for their support by way of providing flights FOC to and from King and Flinders Island for our President and for our AGM prize. This assistance is greatly valued and we thank them for their support. Finally I would like to thank the TMSA Committee and our Executive Officer Wendy Kennedy for their support in my role as Treasurer and also the membership for allowing me the privilege of being involved in such a great organisation as TMSA all for the betterment of Tasmanian Mens

#### AUDIT REPORT TO MEMBERS

#### Scope

I have audited the attached special purpose financial report, comprising the Statement of Cash Payments and Cash Receipts, and Statement of Cash Balances of the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association Inc. for the year ended 30 June 2023. The Association's Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein, and has determined that the accounting policies used are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Association's constitution and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used are appropriate to the needs of the members.

The special purpose financial report has been prepared for distribution to the members of the Association for the purpose of fulfilling the Association's financial reporting requirements under the Association's constitution. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates, to any person other than the members, or of any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

The audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. The procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the cash basis of accounting whereby revenue is recorded when it is received, expenses recorded when they are paid, and no assets or liabilitics, other than cash and bank balances are recorded. Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) are not applicable to the basis of accounting adopted by the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association Inc.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been performed on the above basis.

#### Qualification

As is common for organisations' of this type, it is not practical for the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over all funds receipted and amounts expended until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, the audit in relation to receipts and payments was limited to amounts actually recorded in the books and records of the Association.

#### **Qualified Audit Opinion**

In my opinion, subject to the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had the limitation discussed in the qualification paragraph not existed, the special purpose financial report presents fairly the receipts and payments and its cash balances of the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association Inc, for the year ended 03 June 2023 ni accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act, the explanations given by the Association, and, that the rules relating to the administration of the funds of the Association have been observed.

## Summary of significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted by the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association Incorporated are stated to assist in a general understanding of these accounts.

## Basis of accounting

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to provide accounts which satisfy the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Tasmania) 1964 (as amended).

The financial statements have been prepared on a cash basis whereby items are brought to account as money is paid or received from the records of the Association. Receipts and payments amounts include GST where applicable.

The Committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no requirement to apply Australian Accounting Standards in the preparation and presentation of the financial statements.

## 2. Member's Liability

The Tasmanian Men's Shed Association is incorporated under the Associations IncorporationAct (Tasmania) 1964 (as amended). The members are liable in the event of winding up to an amount not exceeding twenty five dollars (\$25) per member in accordance with Clause 18.2 of the Association's rules.
